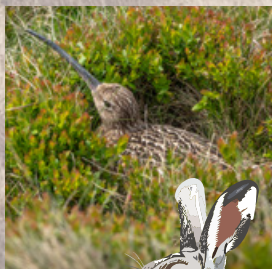


The majority of our volunteering opportunities happen over the winter as our works season runs from September to March (when it's not bird nesting season).

- Don't smoke on or near the moors
- Phone 999 if you spot a suspected wildfire – don't assume someone else has reported it
- Protect wildlife by keeping dogs on a short lead
- Tell your friends about the importance of moorlands.

CONSERVE & RESTORE

We've been working at landscape scale since 2003 to deliver evidence-led nature recovery programmes that take on the challenges of climate change.

Peatlands are a globally rare type of habitat with 20% of it found in Britain and Ireland. When in a healthy state, peatlands are mostly a habitat called blanket bog and are even more effective than rainforests at storing carbon. Other benefits include natural flood management, boosting biodiversity, and helping to reduce the risk of wildfire.

PRACTICAL CONSERVATION
